What is an example of one not for the sake of Heaven? The dispute of Korah and all his company.



■ Numbers 16:9-10 (NKJV) - Is it a small thing to you that the God of Israel has separated you from the congregation of Israel, to bring you near to Himself, to do the work of the tabernacle of the Lord, and to stand before the congregation to serve them; 10 and that He has brought you near to Himself, you and all your brethren, the sons of Levi, with you? And are you seeking the priesthood also?

Shammai and Hillel

The House of Shammai says, "In the evening all should recline (to recite the Shema) but in the morning they should stand up." The House of Hillel says, "They may recite it every one in his own way." (m. Berakhot 1:3)





"If it happens that she finds no favor in his eyes because he has found in her a shameful thing and he writes her a certificate of divorce..." (Deut. 24:1)

The House of Shammai says, "A man should not divorce his wife unless he finds her to be unchaste." The House of Hillel says, "Even if she has burned his food." (m. Gittin 9:10)

For three years Beit Shammai and Beit Hillel disagreed. These said, "The legal ruling (halakah) is in accordance with our teaching," and those said, "The legal ruling is in accordance with our teaching."

A Divine Voice emerged and proclaimed, "Both these and those are the words of the living God. However, the legal ruling is in accordance with Beit Hillel." (Eruvin 13b)

A TORAH OF CHESED

Since both these and those are words of the living God, why were the Hillelites privileged to have the legal ruling established in accordance with their teaching?

Because they were kindly and modest, because they studied not only their own rulings but also those of Beit Shammai and because they taught the words of Beit Shammai before their own.

This is to teach you that anyone who humbles himself, the Holy One exalts him and anyone who exalts himself, the Holy One humbles him.
