"For the rest of the time we had an unusual, even transformative, encounter with the African Bishops, ending with a chassidic-style tisch [festive meal] during which we shared with the Bishops our songs and stories and they taught us theirs. At three in the morning we finished by dancing together. We knew we were different, we knew that there were deep divides between our respective faiths, but we had become friends. Perhaps that is all we should seek. Friends don't have to agree in order to stay friends. And friendships can sometimes help to heal the world." Rabbi Sacks
