
PAUL'S TRAVEL PLANS

Now concerning the collection for the holy ones: you should follow the directions I gave to the churches of Galatia. On the first day of every week, each of you is to put aside and save whatever extra you earn, so that collections need not be taken when I come. And when I arrive, I will send any whom you approve with letters to take your gift (*charis*) to Jerusalem. If it seems advisable that I should go also, they will accompany me.

I will visit you after passing through Macedonia, and perhaps I will stay with you or even spend the winter, so that you may send me on my way, wherever I go. But I will stay here in Ephesus until Shavuot (Pentecost).
